GENERAL ORDER 2017-011

Section 49 Oil and Gas Activities Act

Issued to:

Venturion Oil Limited 1600, 500-4th Avenue SW Calgary, Alberta T2P 2V6

Attention: Mr. Jonathan Wright, Manager of Production and Operations

Order:

Pursuant to section 49(1)(a) of the *Oil and Gas Activities Act* (the Act), I, Lance Ollenberger, order that Venturion Oil Limited (Venturion) must:

1. Immediately shut-in facility, facility ID # 0007696 located at 10-36-81-14 W6M (the Facility).

Conditions:

A. This order shall remain in effect until amended or terminated in whole or in part by the Commission.

Reasons:

I make this order for the following reasons:

- i. Venturion is the permit holder of the Facility (the Permit).
- ii. On April 7, 2017 Oil and Gas Commission staff conducted an inspection of the Facility and determined that:
 - 1) The Vapour Recovery Unit (VRU) at the Facility is not in operation as required by the Permit;
 - 2) The truck loading vent line is not connected to the VRU as required by the Permit; and
 - 3) The Facility is continuously flaring all of the solution gas without permission within the Permit to do so.

- 4) The flaring taking place at the Facility is not being undertaken for maintenance purposes.
- iii. I am of the opinion that Venturion has failed to comply with the Act, Regulations and the Permit.

Review and Appeal:

Venturion may request a review of this order under section 70 of the Act by submitting a request for review to: ogc.determinationreviews@bcogc.ca.
